2.4 MAGNITUDE EARTHQUAKE HITS MID-ARGYLL ON 24th JANUARY

Residents of Furnace might be forgiven for thinking that 4.30 pm on a Tuesday afternoon was a funny time for a quarry blast - and that's certainly what it felt like.

It turned out to be an earth tremor centred on nearby Lephinmore but, according to the British Geological Survey, happened at a depth of 11 km (6.8 miles) below the surface.

Whilst these tremors are not uncommon in this part of the country, this one was quite powerful compared to most that are usually around a magnitude of 1.0 or less.

The tremor was felt from as far away as Dunoon, Tarbert and Ardfern.


